Finishing Well as a Servant of the Lord: A Leader's Legacy

Sunday, December 8/13 (Joshua 23 - 24)

But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord. (Joshua 24:15)

Introduction:

In Joshua 23 - 24 we read the words of a great leader who is eager to summarize God's story and remind God's people of their place in that story. Joshua leaves a legacy of obedience in serving the Lord; a service that comes from a life filled with godly choices.

A. Remember God's Story and your Place in God's Story (23:3 - 11; 24:2 - 13)

B. Encourage Others to find their Place in God's Story (23:1 - 8; 24:1, 14 - 15)

C. Invest in God's Storytellers for the Next Generation (24:16 - 31; Judges 2:6 - 11)

What are the key 'faith decisions' you have made in the past and what are some of the hard choices that you need to continually make in order to follow Christ? Pray with someone about this.
