The Church: Proclaiming the Mystery of God's Wisdom (Ephesians 3:1-13)

This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus. (Eph. 3:6)

Here it will help us to imagine a cosmic drama. The theatre is history. The stage is the world. The actors are the Church. The writer is God, who also directs and produces the drama. And the audience? Cosmic beings - the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. The history of the Christian Church is the graduate school for angels.

Four Questions:

- 1. What is the mystery of Christ? (vs. 6)
- 2. How was the mystery made known? (vs. 1 5)
- 3. How is the mystery made plain? (vs. 7 9)
- 4. What does God intend to accomplish through making the mystery known? (vs. 10 13)

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. In what practical ways can every local church be engaged in making the mystery of Christ known? How are we doing this? How could we do this more effectively?
- 2. As a servant (deacon) of the gospel and as the *'less than the least'* Paul was given the privilege of *preaching* (evangelizing) and *making plain* (shedding light, causing to see) what has been hidden (vs. 8 9). In what way is every Christian called to do the same?
- 3. How is God's wisdom on display through the Church and who is watching? (vs. 10 11)
